### THE CROSS OF SACRIFICE

*During his reign, King Frederick III of Prussia ran into great financial trouble. Wars had been costly and as he tried to rebuild the economy he kept coming up with serious shortfalls. After careful reflection, he decided to ask the women of Prussia to bring their jewelry of gold and silver to be melted down for their country. And for each costly ornament received the king determined to exchange a decoration of iron as a symbol of his gratitude for their service. Each decoration given to the people was inscribed "I gave gold for iron, 1813."*

*The response was overwhelming: the women actually cherished their gifts from the king more than they had their own jewelry! The reason, of course, is clear. The decorations were proof that they had sacrificed for their king. It was a sign of their loyalty. It actually became unfashionable to wear personal jewelry anymore. Thus was established "The Order of the Iron Cross" -- members wore no other ornaments except a cross of iron given to them by their king.*

*Today, when we come to our king, we too exchange the symbols of luxury, prestige and self for a cross -- the symbol of His sacrifice. True, we won't be asked to literally melt down our gold or silver. But we will be asked to get outside of ourselves. And it is not just the symbol of sacrifice that we take on -- but it's a lifestyle of practical and tangible sacrifice.*

*We know that there is no shortage of crosses today. Many people wear them as jewelry, whether they understand the meaning of this holy sign or not. In a day when one jewelry store advertised "half-price crosses," the idea of a "lite" cross seems pretty appealing to many people. But the cross comes with a cost. We know it's true if we read any of the gospels "the whole way though". We find that sacrificial love is what the gospel is all about.*

*May we never forget that God paid that cost for us all. In giving us His Son, God showed us the full extent of his love. And we will never be the same. As we move through this season of Lent, may we remember that our best giving is always a reflection of what God has already done for us: a debt that cannot be repaid.*

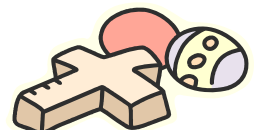


### ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING MARCH 14

## FINANCE MOMENT

The 2010 Budget was approved by the Administrative Council at the January meeting. The budget for 2010 is \$441,809.98. The Chairperson of each Committee requested the amount necessary for the Committee to complete their projects planned during the year. The Committee list and Budget is as follows.

Another way to look at this budget is to think on a weekly basis. The weekly budget for Messiah in 2010 is \$8,496.35. This is the amount of Contributions needed weekly if we are to complete all the projects currently planned for Messiah in 2010. The Finance Committee will be providing financial information in the bulletin and will continue to have a "Finance Moment" in the monthly newsletter.
